Update for school

Dear parents and carers,

I am writing to provide an update on the kindergarten planned to open at our school.

A revised construction schedule means the planned opening of this site has been changed from Term 1, 2026 to Term 2, 2026.

The kindergarten will operate from a temporary location while the works are completed on the new permanent building at our school.

This means that Reservoir Views Primary School Kindergarten (interim name) will operate from Keon Park Children's Hub for Term 1, 2026. Those enrolled will then transfer to the new kindergarten building at our school, when the site opens for Term 2, 2026.

The Victorian School Building Authority (VSBA) is responsible for planning and building the Reservoir Views Primary School Kindergarten.

THUNDERSTORM ASTHMA - BE PREPARED THIS POLLEN SEASON

Grass pollen season, which typically runs from October to December each year in Victoria, brings an increase in asthma and hay fever symptoms. It also increases the risk of thunderstorm. asthma. For people with asthma or hay fever, especially those who experience wheezing or coughing with their hay fever, thunderstorm asthma can be sudden, serious and even life threatening.

Reservoir Views Primary School will implement a range of measures to keep our school community safe as the risk of thunderstorm asthma increases.

Many of our staff are trained in asthma first aid. We will monitor the VicEmergency app to receive thunderstorm warnings and, where appropriate, keep students indoors when weather forecasts identify greater risk.

During the season, there are some things you can do to prepare and protect yourself and your family:

- If your child has ever had asthma, talk to your doctor about what you can do to help protect them from the risk of thunderstorm asthma this pollen season, including updating your asthma action plan. Taking an asthma preventer properly and regularly is key to preventing asthma, including thunderstorm asthma.
- If your child has hay fever, see your pharmacist or doctor for a hay fever treatment plan and check if you should have an asthma reliever puffer. These are available from a pharmacy without a prescription.
- If your child has hay fever and experiences wheezing and coughing, it is important to make sure they don't also have asthma. Speak to your doctor about an asthma action plan.
- Where possible, avoid being outside during thunderstorms from October to December, especially during the wind gusts that come before the storm. Go inside and close your doors and windows. If you have your air conditioning on, turn it to 'recirculate'.

Protect yourself this pollen season – managing asthma and allergies matters.

VICTORIAN GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCEMENT REGARDING DEVICE PURCHASING AND SCREENTIME IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS

Today the Victorian Government announced that from 2027, schools with students in Prep to Grade 6:

- must not invite families to purchase or bring their own student digital devices to use at school from Prep to Grade 6
- should follow new recommended digital device times, including minimal device time for Prep to Grade 2; and a maximum of 90 minutes per day for Grade 3 to 6

I welcome this announcement. This is an equitable and sensible approach that we have always adopted at Reservoir Views.

PARENTS TO SAVE MONEY ON STUDENTS' DIGITAL DEVICES

The Allan Labor Government is easing cost-of-living pressures for families by removing the requirement for parents to provide digital devices for primary school students.

Deputy Premier and Minister for Education Ben Carroll today announced that parents at Victorian Government primary schools will no longer need to buy a device for their children – saving them more than \$500 per student.

Schools will be required to provide access to tablets and laptops for students to use at school. To further support student learning and engagement, screen time limits will also be introduced to all schools.

The changes will be phased in gradually to support schools' transition to the new arrangements.

From 2027, primary schools will benefit from updated guidance to help set sensible limits on device use in the classroom. This will mean that primary schools will be required to limit digital device use to a maximum of 90 minutes per day for students in Years 3-6, and minimal device time for those in Prep to Year 2.

These new time limits will promote purposeful technology use, reduce overexposure to screens and help students stay focused and engaged.

New guidance and support materials will be distributed to schools in term 1 next year to help schools plan lessons using digital devices. This guidance will ensure that students learn essential digital literacy skills, while reducing distractions in the classroom.

These reforms complement Victoria's nation-leading mobile phone restrictions, which were introduced in 2020, ensuring a comprehensive approach to addressing digital distraction, and the overuse and misuse of technology.

Principals and teachers report that the mobile phone ban has improved student focus on learning and increased socialisation and physical activity during breaks.

Students in the Education State are given every chance to succeed at school and beyond the classroom thanks to the Labor Government's investments in our young people.

LEADERSHIP NEWS

RESILIENCE, RIGHTS AND RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS

At Reservoir Views Primary School, we are proud to teach the Respectful Relationships (RRRR) program as part of our focus on student wellbeing and social and emotional learning.

Respectful Relationships is a Victorian Government program that helps children learn about respect, equality and healthy relationships. Through stories, discussions and hands-on activities, students build skills to understand emotions, show empathy, solve problems and form positive friendships. The program is part of the Personal and Social Capability and Health and Physical Education areas of the Victorian Curriculum.

What Respectful Relationships is really about

Sometimes people hear different things about what Respectful Relationships includes. Here are some clear facts to help explain what the program is and what it isn't:

- Myth: Respectful Relationships teaches radical gender theory.
 - **Fact**: It doesn't. The program simply helps students learn about respect and fairness, and how to build positive relationships with others.
- Myth: Education can't help prevent family violence.
 - **Fact**: Research shows that school programs like this make a real difference. When children learn about respect and equality early, it helps create safer, kinder communities.
- Myth: Respectful Relationships teaches about sexuality or gender identity.
 - Fact: It doesn't. The focus is on treating everyone fairly and understanding that everyone deserves respect.
- Myth: It's inappropriate to talk about consent with young children.
 - **Fact**: In Foundation and the early years, consent means simple, everyday things, like asking before borrowing a pencil or joining a game. It's about learning kindness, boundaries and safety.
- Mvth: The lessons aren't age-appropriate.

Fact: The materials, developed by experts at the University of Melbourne, are carefully designed for each year level from Foundation to Year 12. Lessons are taught through age-appropriate stories, discussions, games and role-plays.

How it fits in at RVPS

At RVPS, Respectful Relationships lessons are part of our Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) program. They work alongside The Zones of Regulation, which help students recognise and manage emotions, and they support the Personal and Social Capabilities and Health curriculum areas.

Our teachers weave these lessons through everyday learning, helping children build empathy, resilience and respect, skills that support every part of their education, including Reading, Writing and Maths.

Why we teach it

The Royal Commission into Family Violence found that the best way to prevent family violence is to start early, by helping children understand respect, equality and positive relationships from the beginning of school.

At Reservoir Views Primary School, we want every child to feel safe, valued and supported to show kindness and respect to others. The Respectful Relationships program helps us build this culture, in every classroom, every day.



Over the past two weeks, our Grade 3/4 students have been busy diving into some exciting hands-on learning! In Maths, they have been exploring the concept of capacity by estimating and measuring how much liquid different containers can hold. This practical approach has helped students develop their understanding of volume and improve their measuring skills. In Inquiry, our young investigators have been exploring temperature through a series of fun experiments and investigations. They have been learning about the behaviour of molecules at different temperatures and discovering how heat transfers in three different ways: conduction, convection, and radiation. These activities have sparked curiosity and encouraged students to think critically about everyday examples of heat and temperature in action.

We're so proud of the enthusiasm and engagement our Grade 3/4 students have shown during these lessons, and we look forward to continuing our exploration in the coming weeks!


