














RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS LEADERSHIP FORUM

TERM 4 DATES

INDIVIDUAL FOUCATION PLANS

What are IEPs?

Individual Education Plans (IEPs) are personalised learning documents designed to support your child's growth and achievement. They outline specific learning goals based on your child's current needs and strengths, and provide strategies that teachers, parents, and students can use to work towards these goals together. IEPs are reviewed across each term to monitor progress and new goals are set where appropriate.

What to do when you receive your child's IEP

Next Monday your child will be bringing home their Individual Education Plan with their goals for Term 4. These goals will reflect areas of focus identified by your child's teacher and will include literacy, numeracy, personal and social learning and a goal around behaviours for learning. Students will be encouraged to take ownership of their learning by knowing their goals and reflecting on their progress throughout the term.

When you receive your child's IEP, we encourage you to:

- Read through the goals carefully
- Discuss them with your child in a positive and encouraging way
- Highlight the progress your child has already made and talk about the next steps
- Note down any questions you may wish to raise with your child's teacher at the upcoming Celebration of Learning meeting

Student Celebrations of Learning

At your child's Celebration of Learning meeting, your child will have the opportunity to present highlights from their literacy, numeracy, and inquiry learning this term. These meetings allow students to practise their presentation skills as well as to share their successes, reflect on challenges, and demonstrate pride in their learning.

During the meeting, you will also have the chance to go through the goals set for your child in Term 4. This is a valuable opportunity to ask questions, clarify expectations, and explore how you can best support your child at home.

We encourage you to book your meeting time through Compass. If you are unsure how to do this, please contact our office staff who will be happy to support you. Interpreters are available upon request when you are booking.

What you can do at home to support your child with their goals

Your involvement makes a real difference to your child's progress. At the end of your child's IEP, you will find specific recommendations from their teacher about how to support the goals at home. These may include:

- Reading with your child each night and discussing the stories together.
- Supporting your child to practise their maths skills using their homework tasks or games.
- Encouraging independence, for example, by having them order food at a café, borrow books from the library, or take on small responsibilities at home.
- Playing games that encourage turn-taking and fair play.
- Talking with your child about their learning, their play, and their interests to build conversational confidence.

By practising these strategies at home, you are helping your child build essential skills in literacy and numeracy, develop resilience, strengthen persistence in learning, and grow in confidence when communicating with others.

Stand Up Project - Lessons

Our Stand Up Project (SUP) leaders have been busy visiting classrooms to teach students about building respectful relationships and standing up to poor behaviour.

Last week, they helped everyone understand the difference between mean on purpose behaviour, friendship fires, and bullying. This week, the focus has been on being an upstander, with students learning four practical strategies: Direct, Delay, Delegate, and Distract.

The leaders also introduced the NO-GO-TELL-CHANGE model, giving students clear steps on what to do if they experience bullying.

Our 5/6 SUP leaders are doing an incredible job leading this initiative, and it has been wonderful to see such positive engagement from all classrooms!

Respectful Relationship Student Leaders Forum

Last Thursday, our wellbeing leaders, Sienna and Freddy, attended the Respectful Relationships Wellbeing Leaders Forum at Preston Primary. Leaders from neighbouring schools came together to share and discuss initiatives that promote inclusivity and student voice.

Sienna and Freddy proudly spoke about our Stand Up Project, which focuses on taking a stand against bullying and racism by encouraging all students to be upstanders. Both leaders spoke with confidence and represented Reservoir Views Primary with pride.

They also gained valuable insights from other schools, learning about inspiring initiatives such as toilet projects, First Nations student ambassadors, lunchtime programs, and finding ways to be more visible leaders within the school community.
