#### Swimming

Swimming permission and payment is now available on Compass. Swimming is part of the Victorian Curriculum and will be part of our daily organisation starting week 2 of Term 4.

The Health and Physical Education curriculum includes four focus areas with specific reference to swimming and water safety which schools are required to teach:

- Fundamental movement skills Develop foundation movement and skills to enable students to participate in a range of physical activities. For example, floating and moving the body through water.
- Safety Practise behaviours and skills to keep themselves and others safe in and around water. For example, sun safety, use of protective equipment and first aid.
- Lifelong physical activities— Understand that swimming can enhance lifelong health-related fitness and wellbeing.
- Challenge and adventure activities Participate in challenging swimming activities in a range of contexts. For example, triathlon, diving, water polo.


