
We will also keep reviewing the Auslan Alphabet and the signs for Colours, Numbers and other common signs.

Students were able to sign lots of things to her such as their name and their favourite animal and colour - she was very impressed and excited to see how much we have been learning.












Spelling

In addition to our daily phonics lessons, we have also started spelling lessons to help us remember and use different spelling rules when writing words. For example, 'ai' is in the middle of words (rain) and 'ay' is used at the end (stay) most of the time.

We are continuing to read daily at school during fluency pairs. Reading a text multiple times increases our fluency. We encourage students to reread texts more than once at home as well. We have also started Maths groups across the 1/2 cohort to support students' learning goals and needs. Students will be working in groups daily to support the development of vital number skills.

There were many questions that we asked like, how do you communicate to your hearing friends?




