

This term we will be having images from our amazing mural transferred onto windows across the school. Below are a few of the designs.





What is Visible Wellbeing ™?



'Teachers are learners too'

Designed by award winning and internationally acclaimed psychology researcher, Professor Leah Waters, AM PhD, Visible Wellbeing ™ . Visible wellbeing combines the science of wellbeing with the science of learning to achieve the key goals of:

- -helping students and staff to more clearly see their own and other's wellbeing using Visible Wellbeing practises
- -helping students and staff more systematically build wellbeing using the SEARCH framework
- -facilitating learning through the visible wellbeing process, this is not a program, it's a way of doing things

All staff began their Visible Wellbeing learning on the first day of school. This learning journey will continue for the next 18 months where staff will continue to learn and implement this throughout this time in a sustainable way.

ONPSYCH

Onpsych is a team of experienced, qualified, registered and accredited psychologists, mental health social workers and counsellors who specialise in child and adolescent services. SCHOOL ATTENDANCE / PUNCTUALITY

Student attendance will continue to be a whole school focus this year. We understand absence from school is unavoidable at times with illness etc but attending school on a regular basis is vital for all students in Foundation to Grade 6 so that they can access all they need to learn throughout their 7 years of primary schooling.

Students being present at line up areas prior to 9am is also incredibly important. I will add that staff are on yard duty from 8:45am each morning.

STAFF CAR PARK

For obvious safety reasons, can I please ask all students and families NOT to enter the school through the staff car park, please use the main entrance gate. Thank you.

PARKING / CAR SAFETY AROUND OUR SCHOOL / PLEASE USE SUPERVISED CROSSING AREAS

Could I please ask all of our families to follow the parking restrictions/rules that are in place during school drop-off and pick-up times around our school and please practise safe road crossing and abide by driving laws and common sense. The parking restrictions are there for a reason - to keep school crossing areas free from obstruction and ultimately to keep our community safe.

Can I please urge all families to use the supervised school crossings on Hickford St and St Vigeons Rd and not take a shortcut in between cars. It may save a minute out of your trip but it's just not worth it taking the risk.

SUN SMART

Just a reminder that we are a SunSmart school and from the 1st of September until the end of April, it is compulsory for all students to wear a SunSmart hat (wide brimmed or legionnaire style) for all outdoor activities. Hats are available at the office for \$12. If you would like your child to apply sunscreen, it's easiest for them to have the roll-on applicator. MEDICAL INFORMATION

A reminder to please complete and send back to school ASAP the medical information form that was sent home last week. Also don't forget to check with us if Ventolin, EpiPen or medication has expired and needs replacing.

CSEF

If you hold a current Health Care Card, please do not forget to apply for the CSEF (Camp, Sports and Excursion Fund).

UNIFORM

Please remember to clearly label students' uniforms, so that it is easily identified, if it ends up in lost property.

OFFICE AS A THOROUGHFARE

If you are not needing to access staff at the front office can I please request that this area is not used as a thoroughfare.

MOBILE PHONES POLICY

Our school, as all Victorian Government schools, have a mobile phones policy. We understand that students may bring a personal mobile phone to school, particularly if they are travelling independently to and from school. Any phone that is brought to school needs to be handed to the office upon arrival and picked up upon departure from school. ANNIVERSARY OF THE APOLOGY TO THE STOLEN GENERATIONS







In 2008, then-Prime Minister Kevin Rudd apologised on behalf of the Australian Government to the Stolen Generations – the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children who were forcibly removed from their families and communities by successive colonial and Australian governments.

This Tuesday the 13th of February is the 16th anniversary of this significant event and it is an important time to reflect on how Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples have been, and will continue to be affected by past policies of the Australian Government. We are committed at Reservoir Views to telling the truth about Australia's history, reflecting on past injustices while acknowledging the strength, resilience and cultural identity of Indigenous Australians.

We are SunSmart

- a note for families

Too much of the sun's ultraviolet (UV) radiation can cause sunburn, skin and eye damage and skin cancer.

UV damage accumulated during childhood and adolescence is associated with an increased risk of skin cancer later in life. Skin cancer is the most common cancer in Australia. It is also one of the most preventable cancers.

You can't see or feel the sun's UV. Whatever the weather, if the UV levels are three or more, it's important to Slip, Slop, Slap, Seek and Slide!

Sun protection times

Don't just wait for hot and sunny days to use sun protection. Check the sun protection times each day so your family can be protected when they need to be.

Daily local sun protection times and weather details are available from the SunSmart widget on our school website, in the weather section of the newspaper, on the SunSmart website at sunsmart.com.au and as a free SunSmart app. Sun protection times can also be found at the Bureau of Meteorology website and live UV levels are available from ARPANSA.

SunSmart membership

Our school is a registered member of Cancer Council Victoria's SunSmart Schools Program. We aim to protect children and staff from too much UV.

Sun protection and skin cancer prevention is a shared responsibility. Please help support our SunSmart membership and sun protection efforts by ensuring your child follows the SunSmart measures included in our policy at school and at home.

During the daily local sun protection times (usually from mid-August to the end of April), use these 5 SunSmart steps – even if it's cool and cloudy.

1. SLIP on covering clothing

For free dress days, ensure your child wears clothing that covers as much skin as possible (e.g. elbow length tops with a higher neckline or collar and longer style shorts or skirts). Densely woven fabrics are best.



SLOP on SPF30 (or higher) broadspectrum, water-resistant sunscreen

Apply a generous amount of sunscreen at the start of the day and make sure children have sunscreen in their bag ready to reapply throughout the day. Sunscreen should be reapplied every two hours. Please ensure children get plenty of sunscreen application practice at home so they'll be all set when they are at school. Under supervision, ask children to put a dot of sunscreen on each cheek, nose and chin and rub it in (avoiding the eye area) and sunscreen squiggles or dots on the back of the neck, arms and legs to cover these areas.

3. SLAP on a hat that protects the face, neck and ears

Choose a wide-brimmed, legionnaire or bucket hat. Peak caps and visors do not offer enough UV protection so please leave them at home. Please help your child remember to bring and wear their approved school hat. Please keep this at school so they will always be ready for outdoor activities, outdoor learning and play during school days. For the walk to and from school and weekends, please have an extra home hat to help keep children protected at home.

4. SEEK shade

Choose shady spots for learning and play whenever possible.

SLIDE on wrap-around AS1067 sunglasses
 When appropriate and practical, help protect the eyes with sunglasses.
