

Playgroup will be run in the new portable.


SCHOOL VALUE AWARDS

Education and Training

LITERACY

In literacy, the F/1 students have been reading "The last tree in the city" to align with our inquiry focus. The students have been working hard on their writing!





FIA

NUMERACY The F/1 students have been learning about numberbonds and we are focusing on equations, using manipulatives to support their understanding.

NEWS



INQUIRY The students have been learning about plants and the various parts of the plants. They can identify the roots, stem, leaves, flower, fruit and seeds. We have experimented with celery in water, which showed us how water travels up the stem of the plant. We have also planted our own beans and we are currently exploring what happens when we don't give a plant what it needs to survive.

1/2 NEWS

Inquiry

This week sees us wrapping up our Inquiry around Indigenous seasons. We have learnt that seasons can vary greatly between language groups and around the country. We have loved learning about the 6 seasons of Kakadu, Arnhem Land, the Darug Country in Western Sydney, Bardi Country in the Kimberly and the 7 seasons of Wurundjeri people of the Kulin Nation.









Maths

As well as using clocks to tell the time to the hour and half past the hour, we have continued working on addition and subtraction strategies, such as using number lines to solve subtraction problems by finding the difference, and adding 2 digit numbers. This week we have looked at fractions, estimating distance and using problem solving skills to order objects by mass.



In the Classroom

We have been working hard to check our work for boundary punctuation – making sure that we use a capital letter at the beginning and punctuation at the end of sentences. We are developing our understanding of sentence types, especially questions and statement, which helps us decide the correct punctuation to use. This week, we are working our way further through the writing process, having brainstormed and drafted our Haiku poems, we are up to revising and editing. We can't wait to share some of our completed work with you!


