














### **Thursday 4th September here at school**



Playgroup is free, and we welcome our community to bring along their preschool-aged child / children for some fun.





#### PHONICS PLUS

#### Foundation to Year 2

From 2025, all Victorian government schools will begin using a new reading program called Phonics Plus in Prep to Year 2. This program teaches children how sounds and letters work together to make words. For example, when children learn the sounds for c-a-t, they can blend them to read cat. This step-by-step approach, known as systematic synthetic phonics, is supported by research as one of the most effective ways to help children become confident readers.

In classrooms, students will take part in short, daily phonics lessons, where they practise sounding out words and reading books that are carefully matched to the sounds they are learning. These are called decodable books. For example, if students are learning the "sh" sound, they might read a story with words like "ship," "shop," and "fish." This helps children feel successful and build confidence as readers.

Alongside this, children will learn Heart Words. These are high-frequency words that can't always be sounded out using the usual rules (for example, said or the). We call them Heart Words because children need to learn them "by heart" so they can recognise them quickly when reading.

At our school, we use Decodable Readers Australia as part of our phonics program. These are the readers your child brings home each night in the early years. Families play a big role here; listening to your child read each night, encouraging them to "sound out" tricky words, and celebrating their successes makes a huge difference. Even five to ten minutes a day helps build confidence and fluency.

Another important change is the introduction of a short phonics check for Year 1 students. This simple activity helps teachers see which sounds and words students know and identify anyone who may need extra support. It means children who find reading tricky can be helped earlier, before small gaps become bigger challenges.

#### After Year 2

Once students have a strong base in phonics, the focus shifts to reading with greater fluency, comprehension, and vocabulary. Children begin to move from simply "sounding out" words to reading more smoothly and understanding the meaning of what they read.

At this stage, students are also introduced to morphology; learning how words are built from smaller parts, such as prefixes (un- in unhappy), suffixes (-ed in jumped), and root words (play in playful). Understanding these patterns helps students read and spell more complex words and grow their vocabulary. For example, if they know happy, they can more easily read unhappy or happiness.

This stage also focuses on comprehension; students learn to make predictions, ask questions, summarise, and talk about characters and ideas in texts. These skills are essential as children begin to read longer novels, information texts, and digital sources.

## How you can help your child's reading: In Prep to Year 2:

- Listen to your child read their Decodable Reader Australia each night.
- Encourage them to sound out words and blend the sounds.
- Practise Heart Words together so they can be recognised quickly.

#### **Bevond Year 2:**

Talk about new or interesting words, including prefixes and suffixes (e.g., disagree, kindness). Ask your child questions about what they read: Why do you think the character did that? What might happen next?

Encourage them to explain ideas in their own words to build comprehension.

Share a wide range of reading materials such as novels, magazines, websites, and information texts. Model being a reader yourself, let your child see you reading and enjoying books.




