## This week at School

Foundation/1 classes have continued to explore 'Our World' through Literacy and Inquiry. The story 'Wombat Stew' let them explore the Australian Outback and the animals that live there. Writing has also linked to this book and all students have written sentences based on the story.

In Numeracy students have been consolidating our understanding of addition, friends of 10 and weighing objects. We used hefting and scales to determine the weight of classroom objects.

## Incursion

On Wednesday the students took part in an incursion run by Zoos Victoria where they learnt all about the Orange-Bellied Parrot. The zoo keepers shared lots of information and answered students questions.













### Science




#### PHONICS FUN!

We also use soundline spelling and dictation to practise spelling words with the focus sound. This week, we have been learning how to read and spell words with the /ou//ow/ sound (as in loud and cow).



#### NATIONAL RECONCILIATION WEEK

The last two weeks we have been developing our knowledge and understanding of National Reconciliation week. We looked at two key dates: The 1967 Referendum and the Mabo Decision. We were shocked to learn that before 1967, First Nations People were not counted in the census!

# YEAR 5/6 AREA newsletter



Writing
Over the last few weeks we have been focusing on writing narratives. We have learnt about different plot types such as warning tales, conquering the monster and a tale of fear. Students have enjoyed writing their stories.







We love practising our reading fluency with our partners. Everyday we read a short text aloud, our partner checks to see if we are pausing, selfcorrecting and they help us if we make an error.

#### Home Reading

Just a reminder that all students should be reading at home every day. Students need to read silently for 20 minutes per night and at least 3 minutes of reading aloud (this helps with reading fluency)





We have been learning about multiplication with large numbers. Students have been working in small groups.

Each week your child will get maths homework that is tailored to their learning needs. Homework is given out each Monday and due on Friday


















## **Printing in Action!**
