ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL'S REPORT Teaching & Learning

Last week was planning week, this is where teacher cohorts plan for the following term. Term 2's throughline is 'Sustainability', this means that the whole school will be learning about Sustainability as their focus. Of coarse this will look different throughout the school in different year levels, however, students can also come together to learn from each other.

Part of the day involves student 'voice' and 'agency'. Our students sit down together with their teachers to put forward their thoughts, questions, ideas and interests.





Teachers will take these questions, and within limits, will apply it to their learning. Foundation students asked, 'How does rubbish impact the environment?' and 'How can we make it better?' These are fantastic questions, and once they begin learning, I am sure there will be more questions to investigate.

Year 4/5/6 students stated, 'We have learnt about sustainability before, but what impact are we really having' and 'As a school, what are we doing about our carbon footprint?'

I can't wait to see what our students inquire

into. I'm sure the more they find out, the more they will question, ensuring a deep understanding of their knowledge on Sustainability to be able to leave their legacy at Reservoir Views PS.

We've made it to the end of our FIRST EVER Term of school! Ms. Lou and Mr. Dylan are so impressed with how much we have learned, how focussed we have been during learning time and how well we have adjusted to school routines and expectations!

Personal and Social - A key focus at Reservoir Views Primary School is student wellbeing and we've incorporated this daily throughout Term One. In addition to exploring our emotions and how our bodies feel when happy, sad and angry, we've also learned strategies to help regulate our emotions. We've become experts at calming our brains after lunchtime and making sure we are ready to learn. Mr. Dylan also runs a lunchtime mindfulness club twice a week for quiet and calm play where we practice more mindfulness activities, colour, and draw.

Literacy - So far this term we have



learned the letter names and sounds for s a t p i n b c h d g o e k f r u l. That's a lot of letters! We're also learning to blend those sounds into some words (c a t makes cat), how to express our ideas in full sentences (orally and written), and all about adjectives. We even had a responsible pet ownership incursion where a lady brought in her dog and we came up with words to describe the dog, such as calm, soft, fluffy and beautiful. A reminder that the best way you can help us with our learning is to practice the letters and heart words in the blue folders in our reader folders.

Numeracy - Throughout the term we have explored numbers and counting, and practiced strategies good mathematicians use. We've also explored shape, patterns, and continue our countdown to 100 days of school. As of now we are up to thirty-four and know have learned how to represent that as words, numerals, tallies, and in collections.




4/5/6 Area

In term 2, all students in years 3-6 will do a unit on ukulele. If any grade 3-6 students have a ukulele or (acoustic) guitar at home, they are welcome to bring it to school on their Music days. In Foundation-Year 4, students have been tuning in their ears to the WordS in music. The words contain important clues such as

instructions on how to move (e.g. walk, skip, dance) or when to do an action (e.g. bounce the ball). We have also been working on clapping or playing exactly in time with the

WOrdS. This requires very close listening not only to the words but also what our hands are doing at the same time.




Grub Club
