Welcome back! Can you believe that for our Foundation students, it is the last term of your child's first school year of school. We have much to look forward to this term including swimming and graduation. We'll have more info sent home about these events shortly.

In Maths, we have been learning about capacity. We took advantage of a sunny day to show the different capacities we have learnt about (full. half full, nearly empty etc.) and investigated how we could prove if one container holds more than another. For Inquiry, we have been using our senses to describe the properties of different materials. We have also explored 'magnetic' and 'waterproof' as properties and what these mean.

Fire Ed - We were fortunate enough to have a visit from the fire fighters on Monday. We learnt the difference between safe and unsafe fires, who to call in an emergency, and why we should 'crawl down low and go, go, go!' if there is a fire. You will notice a homework page from the firies too this week. Please talk to your child about where your familiy's safe meeting place is outside in the event of a fire. We can't wait for them to come back next week - they have promised to bring the fire truck and will even let us use the hose!

SPELLING

This term, we are starting to learning about the 31 spelling rules of the English language. In week 1, we learnt about the first 3 rules including, English words can't end in i, u, v, j, 'qu' must always be together and every syllable has a vowel sound. Each day we do a dictation sentence about our spelling rule to help us practise and remember these rules.



MORPHOLOGY

Last week we started learning about morphology! Morphology is the study of words and their parts. Morphemes, like prefixes, suffixes and base words are the smallest units of meaning in a word. Morphology helps us with phonics - for reading and spelling as well as enhancing our vocabulary and comprehension of texts.

Handwriting


This term we are working really hard to write using our cursive writing. It takes a lot of slow, careful practice to be able to do this neatly every time!




Debating & Writing







In Foundation/1, we are learning to communicate about the music we hear, using movement and words.
