Dear Reservoir Views students, families and local community members,

As part of the school improvement cycle, each Victorian government school undertakes a review every four years. The school community completes a comprehensive self-evaluation against the Framework for Improving Student Outcomes continua of practice, which should involve students, teachers and community members. An independent analysis is also completed of a school's performance against their goals and targets in their school strategic plan. The review evaluates the school's strengths, areas for improvement and the impact of its improvement efforts. At the end of the review, a new four-year school strategic plan is created and endorsed by the school community.

Reservoir Views' review is currently underway. It is a three day process that is facilitated by an external school reviewer, Carol Every, and includes a review panel consisting of Hayriye and myself, our school council president, Dom Barr, my boss, Graham Stevenson, two challenge partners, principal of Reservoir East Primary School, James Cumming, and teaching partner, Jessica McKay.

Student, teacher and parent forums are an essential element of the review process to ascertain perceptions of how the school is travelling.

### **SCHOOL REVIEW PARENT FORUM WEDNESDAY 6th NOVEMBER STAFF ROOM 9.00 – 9.45am**

As part of our School Review process, a 'Fieldwork' day is being held on Wednesday of next week to undertake student, teacher and parent forums. Part of this day is the opportunity for parents to have their say in an informal forum with our reviewer, Carol Every and my boss, Graham Stevenson. The forum will take place in the staff room straight after the 9am bell. Why not hang around have your say about the good things at our school and the things that may need improvement? There is no need to RSVP – just turn up after the bell rings at 9.00 am.
