#### THIS WEEK IN F/1

In Maths we have been exploring length and using informal measurement to find out how tall we are. We have been exploring what more and less means, and finding out about position words like behind, in front under and beside mean. In literacy, we are learning letters with straight lines that 'start at the heart' (see homework books), continue to practise reading and writing using the letters and sounds we are learning, and have been finding the 'who' and 'what' in sentences.

This week in Inquiry, we begin exploring our 5 senses.

Park in the Northern Territory.


We have located Australia's nearest neighbouring countries and learnt that Indonesia has ten times the population of Australia, with about 270 million people! Murpheys haystack Hostac

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Grades F-2 are learning to follow a leader in music, which requires some very alert looking, careful listening, and quick thinking. Look at these amazing young conductors!




The instruments are coming out for grades 3-6, who have been using OSTINATO to create beautiful accompaniments on xylophones and metallophones.




#### Thank you!

#### Grubs to the garden!

We have a regular group of students who are ready each week armed with watering cans and trowels to look after our veggie gardens. We have 6 raised garden beds currently and are learning how to remove weeds by digging up the roots. After we weed, it's really important to add mulch to discourage more weeds growing. As a bonus, the mulch adds nutrients to the soil for our veggies and helps to keep the garden from drying out.



**Tasks coming up:** checking the compost, sowing autumn vegetable seeds, and adding more mulch to the vegetable gardens.


