

UNSAFE ROAD / DRIVING / PARKING / CROSSING BEHAVIOUR

I am incredibly concerned about the safety of our students and wider community with the behaviour by some members of our community.

I have witnessed countless instances of families ignoring the two designated school crossing areas on St Vigeons Rd and Hickford St and choose to put the safety of children (and themselves) at risk by choosing to cross in between park cars/moving traffic at the busiest times of the day. We are trying to teach students safe travel skills they can use for life and encouraging/modelling this behaviour when there is a supervised crossing area 50m away is just dangerous.

Some of our families are also choosing to make 3 point turns into driveways to avoid driving 200m to do a u-turn. Can I please stress that these choices, while possibly saving 1 minute, are incredibly dangerous. These often are taking place right next to the school crossing area and are violating local laws and jeopardising the safety of students and families doing the right thing. Our school crossing supervisors have absolutely no line of sight when this occurs. Some of our families are dropping students off in the middle of the school crossing areas, again this is dangerous and reckless behaviour.

I will be requesting a stronger presence of City of Darebin officials/road safety officers to ensure coming to and leaving school is as safe as it can be for our students.



The Foundation students had fun playing the game 'Guess the Farm Animal' with their Grade 6 buddies.




