We invite you to our upcoming face-to-face workshops on online safety and digital wellbeing for children. The sessions will be led by Bec and Steve from Evolve Education, who will provide practical strategies and resources to help you promote online safety at home.

As parents and carers, you play a critical role in ensuring your child's safety and wellbeing online. With the prevalence of technology in our lives, it's essential to equip ourselves with the skills and knowledge to navigate the digital world safely.


National Simultaneous Story-Time





YEAR 6 ANTI-RACISM WORKSHOP


