






















RESERVOIR STOMP

Week & Update

At the time of writing this there are only 19 days of school to go. Foundation students are currently revising literacy and numeracy concepts explored across the year and completing assessments to demonstrate what they have learned. We are extremely proud of our students for their focus and effort during this time. Everyone is trying their best and it's amazing to see how much growth has been achieved in another unusual year - Ms. Lou and Mr. Dylan.

We've been so busy at school this past fortnight, completing assessments with our teachers' and revising learning completed across the year. In literacy, we are writing detailed and interesting sentences and practising proofreading and editing our work - if you ask us what that means I bet we could tell you! We're practising reading as a whole class, in groups, and in pairs, demonstrating our knowledge and supporting our friends simultaneously. In maths, we have been working hard on addition and subtraction, doubles to 5, and friends of 10 (two numbers that add to 10 e.g. I and 9, 2 and 8, 3 and 7) - a great way you can support us with that learning is to practice with us at home!

We recently learned that graduation means celebrating finishing something - so we are preparing to celebrate finishing our first year of primary school! We have a song and dance that we're learning and can't wait to perform. The school will tell our parents details of this graduation very soon - watch this space!

TASKWORKS - Exploring Forces Incursion!

BUDDY MEETING



The students decided to practice asking questions to prepare for the buddy meeting. Early in the week we wrote a letter introducing ourselves and drawing pictures. MATHS

READING

In 3/4 we have started reading a new novel. We have started reading a book called 'Bob the builder and the elves'. This text written by Emily Rodda and uses description and character voice to bring the characters to life.

The students have enjoyed reading with expression, matching their visualiations of Bob to the description in the text and learning about the mischievous elves.



During Maths lessons, students have enjoyed applying their knowledge of fractions to chance experiments. Students investigated the chance of landing on a particular number when rolling a dice. Students were then challenged to consider the changes to the probability when additional dice are added. The students enjoyed working collaboratively, testing their theories and applying their understandings.




Narrative Story
